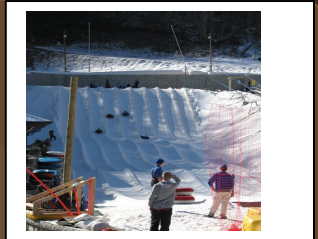
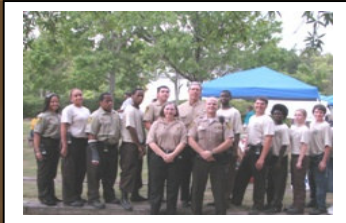
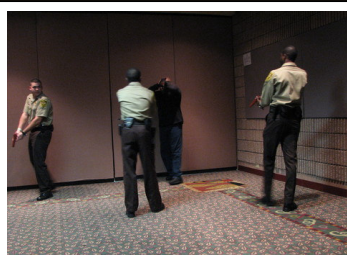


Jefferson County Sheriffs Office Explorers

Explorer Post 245 has been sponsored by the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office since 1969. The Explorers are given a hands-on experience of law enforcement procedures and techniques. Law Enforcement Exploring is a program through Learning for Life, a division of Boy Scouts of America. The Exploring program is specifically designed to incorporate the following experience areas: career opportunities, life skills, service learning, character education, leadership experience, and community service

Explorers have the opportunity to attend the Alabama Law Enforcement Explorer Academy for one week in the summer.

Skilled law enforcement advisors as well as specialized law enforcement experts instruct the explorers on the use of techniques and laws at the meetings. Training that includes:

- Arrest and Patrol Procedures
- Traffic Control
- Assisting Citizens
- Crime Prevention
- Forensic Science
- Basic First Aid
- Fingerprinting
- Report Writing
- Radio Procedures
- Firearms Safety and Training.
